<u>Tree planting on the agenda</u> - late 2019 saw a surge of interest in tree planting. For example, during the December election campaign in the UK, political parties competed over how many trees they would plant if they were elected.

<u>Call to return half of UK farmland to nature</u> - there are signs that the UK government is shifting in the direction of reducing the extent of farmland, and returning swathes of land to nature.

Rise in climate change awareness - several events in 2019 demonstrated increased public awareness and understanding of the importance of climate change.
