At COP28, we will be working with our partners to help ensure a successful outcome for nature, in particular helping negotiators understand the many ways biodiverse nature-based solutions support adaptation to climate change and of ensuring they are implemented in ways that fully respect the rights, knowledge and leadership of Indigenous Peoples and local communities. We will also be highlighting the critical importance that nature-based solutions are implemented in tandem with rapid GHG emissions reductions.

We will be speaking at a variety of events, and launching briefings on the importance of ensuring nature-based solutions are not used in greenwashing and on how to achieve synergies between the climate and biodiversity agendas. On Nature Day (9th December) we will also be sharing our new Nature-based Solutions

Knowledge Hub on tools and guidance for scaling up nature-based solutions in the UK, as well as our interactive map of good practice examples of nature-based solutions from across the globe.








